## Leading Causes of Death




## Definition

The leading causes of death are the underlying causes of death that account for the highest number of all deaths in a population in a given time period. The leading causes of death are presented in rank order and are ranked according to the age-adjusted mortality rate. Ranking the leading causes of death is a common way to look at mortality data and to monitor the burden of various diseases and behaviors. For the International Classification of Diseases-10 (ICD-10) code categorization, visit the <u>National Center for</u> Health Statistics.

## Note about chart and tables

- » The chart on the previous page is a type of line chart called a bump plot which displays how rank changes over time. The Y-axis shows a cause of death's rank from the 1st leading cause of death to the 6th leading cause of death. The X-axis shows the years 2017-2022. By tracking the lines, you can see how a specific cause of death moves up or down in rank over time.
- » The tables below show the top ten leading causes of death by sex for Alaska Native People and non-Alaska Native people statewide.

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## Summary

- » From 2017-2022 heart disease and cancer remained the first and second leading causes of death for Alaska Native people statewide. These two causes of death accounted for 36.2% of all deaths of Alaska Native people during this time period.
- » The Alaska Native mortality rates were significantly higher than the non-Alaska Native rates for the six leading causes of death.
- » In 2021, COVID-19 temporarily surpassed unintentional injuries as the third leading cause of death.
- » For 2021, the <u>CDC lists heart disease as the leading</u> <u>cause of death in the United States</u> and <u>Cancer as</u> <u>the leading cause of death for Alaska</u>.
