



SAMPLE PROJECTS/PROGRAMS

- Increase capacity for conducting outbreak investigations and response.
- Conduct assessment of STI prevention and care services and improve relevant interventions to reduce the burden of STIs.
- Conduct internal or external public health infrastructure or community health needs assessment.
- Develop/update/exercise emergency preparedness plans for public health emergencies.
- Implement and evaluate a new public health intervention to promote health or address disparities in AN/AI communities.
- Assess and support Environmental Health emerging needs of local communities.



APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Application must include the following documents:

- 1. Application signed by authorized representative
- 2. Workplan with goals, objectives, activities, timelines and evaluation
- 3. Budget and budget narrative using template provided
- 4. Contact information form using template provided

Not required but recommended: Include potential impact on community


