
Unintentional Injury Deaths

During 2014-2023:


- There were 1,717 unintentional injury deaths among Alaska Native people (138 per 100,000) and 3,035 among non-Alaska Native people (53 per 100,000)
- There were 1,069 unintentional injury deaths among Alaska Native males (174 per 100,000) and 648 among Alaska Native females (105 per 100,000)
- Alaska Native people aged 70+ years had the highest unintentional injury death rate among any age group (251 per 100,000)
- The top five mechanisms for unintentional injury deaths among Alaska Native people were: Poisoning (770 deaths), Drowning (180 deaths), Motor Vehicle (150 deaths), Exposure to Natural Forces (127 deaths), and Fall (119 deaths)






